IMPORTANT! NEW THIS YEAR

Junior Staff in Training Program

A great opportunity for enrolled children who have completed at least 5th grade (younger campers may be eligible if recommended by staff) to help with younger school-age groups and help plan and lead camp activities. Provides training in leadership, decision making, and youth development. (Does not affect enrollment or rate.)

To Apply: Pick up an application packet at any of our program locations. Application process includes an interview with a camp leader and references.

Peer Groups (By Age)

Younger School-age (YSA): grade K-2; Older School-age (OSA): grade 3-6

When planning for Summer Camp enrollment:

3. There is a 10-day minimum (days do not need to be consecutive).
