

Pre-Writing	<p>Tape markers to any type of toy with wheels to create a vehicle that draws as your child moves it on paper.</p>  <p><i>Drawing with Cars</i></p> <p><i>fun mark making for toddlers</i> Clara's Little Tots</p>	<p>Use clothespins to clip onto any object in your home.</p> 	<p>Fill a bin with water and give your child a turkey baster or any type of dropper. Encourage your child to transfer the water from the bin to another empty container with the baster or dropper.</p> 	<p>Play with playdough! Rolling pins, plastic knives, pipe cleaners, cookie cutters and more can be used while playing.</p> 	<p>Transfer blocks or any small household item from one container to another using tongs.</p> 
Math	<p>Set the table together and count the number of plates needed. Repeat for each item used to set the table.</p>	<p>Stacking Blocks: Stacking blocks is simple, but quite impressive, because it is one of the first forms of geometry that toddlers learn. Build tall towers and short towers. Count the number of blocks for your child.</p>	<p>What Size is It? Ask your child to pick various items in your home for this activity. Toys, cooking utensils, canned food, etc. can be used. Compare the items with your child. Which items are big and which items are small.</p>	<p>PomPom Scoop: Write 1 to 10 on ten plastic drinking cups using a black sharpie. When your toddler is done with this activity, save these cups to use in other counting activities in the future. Your child may want to play in the water a bit. That's ok,</p>	<p>Puzzles: Put a puzzle together with your child.</p> 

				<p>too! Scoop the pom poms out of the water and count as you put them into the numbered cups. If ten cups are too much, start with numbers 1-5.</p>

Draw lines for your child to follow and jump on.</p> 	<p>Plate Game: Attach 4 plates to the wall numbered 1-5. Use a soft ball and have your child throw the ball at the plates. You can use this fun game for counting and color identification together!</p>	<p>Ball Transfer – Water Game</p> <p>You will need: balls/plastic eggs, 2 tubs or bowls, a large spoon</p> <p>Transfer the balls from one bin to another using the large spoon.</p>	<p>To get your kids moving, by walking like different animals.</p> <p>Bear: Walk on all fours, legs straight, bum in the air like a bear. Feel free to stand up and roar occasionally</p> <p>Snake: Slither along the floor on your belly like a snake.</p> <p>Kangaroo: Hop, hop, hop across the room like a kangaroo.</p> <p>Crab: Crawl across the floor on all fours, with your back towards the</p>



floor, and your tummy and face towards the ceiling.

Bird: Walk around arms flapping like the wings of your kid's favorite bird or insect.

Dinosaur: Stomp around the room like a T-Rex. Big feet, little arms.
