Reading	<p>Read or listen to the story <i>Cloudy With a Chance of Meatballs</i>. Talk about the author and illustrator. Before, during, and after reading ask questions like “Look at the cover, what do you think this book is about?” “What do you think will happen next?” “Who was your favorite character?” “What was your favorite part of the story?”</p>
Pre-Writing	<p>While listening to the story <i>Cloudy With a Chance of Meatballs</i>, think about what food or object you would like it to rain. Would you want it to rain meatballs, or pizza, or maybe puppies? Draw a picture of what you would like it to rain. You can use crayons, markers, or paint.</p>	<p>Water and sidewalk painting; Gather a cup of water and head outside. Have the child name a letter. If necessary, write the letter they named on the sidewalk by dipping a finger in water and writing it. Have the child write that letter.</p>	<p>Draw your own zoo. When having your child make his/her own zoo, be sure to fix the three point finger grip. You can use different materials, like markers, pencils, pens or water color. Have your child describe what would need to be in each habitat.</p>	<p>Cut out circles so that your child can write one letter of their name on each one. Then they can put the letters in order to spell their name. Feel free to add legs or decorate your bug however you want! If you don't have construction paper, you can use paper plates instead!</p> 	<p>Children can make their name out of things only found in nature! When going outside to play or go for a walk take a small bag or container and let your child pick up small items like rocks, sticks, grass, flowers, etc... Talk about the letters in their names and the sounds those letters make.</p>

Math	<p>Make spaghetti and meatballs together! How many cups of water did you add to the pan? Use different sized measuring cups—talk about which sizes are bigger, smaller. Can you count out 10 meatballs? What about 15 meatballs? Can you add 4 meatballs and 3 meatballs?</p>	<p>Number boxes; Draw boxes on a piece of paper and write a number in it. Have the child identify the number. Have the child put stickers in the box according to the identified number.</p>	<p>Label boxes with numerals, then have your child place that many stuffed animals in the boxes/cages. Depending on your child’s counting and number recognition abilities start with 1-5 then increase numerals to more difficult and higher numbers. Count with your child if he/she gets stuck on specific numbers.</p>	<p>Get outside and do some gardening! Find some bugs and count how many different bugs you can find and how many legs they have. See if you can find all the bugs that were in the book!</p>	<p>Let children help make a hopscotch outside on a nice day. They can help with numbering the blocks. Then, let them pick a rock and have them gently toss it onto the path and identify the number the rock lands on. When hopping down the path they must avoid touching that number.</p>
Science/ Social Studies	<p>Talk about the weather. Is it rainy, sunny, or cloudy. Create a weather graph. https://boymamateacher.com/2015/02/23/teacher-mama-free-daily-weather-graph/</p>	<p>Science homemade paint recipe; Gather 1 cup flour, ¾ cup water, ¼ cup dish soap, and desired food coloring. Mix water and flour together. Mix in dish soap. If making more than one color, divide mixture. Add desired color of food coloring and mix. Store in closed container.</p>	<p>Live Zoo cameras https://nationalzoo.si.edu/webcams</p> <p>Discuss what animals live in the zoo versus what animals live at a farm or in your house.</p>	<p>Work together to make some dirt pudding and add some gummy worms https://astheygrowup.com/dirt-pudding-cups/ You will need: oreos (chocolate cookies), chocolate pudding, and gummy worms (or other bug candy)</p>	<p>Make a map of your house. Give them paper and they can walk around their house and draw the rooms where they think they are.</p>
Art	<p>Use a fork to paint a picture. What can you make?</p>	<p>Using the homemade paint, have the child finger paint something they see outside. This might be a flower, tree, bird, bush, sun, clouds, etc.</p>	<p>Using supplies around the house (playdough, popsicle sticks, legos, blocks, cups, cardboard etc) build cages for animals at the zoo.</p>	<p>Color with sidewalk chalk, drawing bugs or practice writing names and letters. Name the colors of the chalk your child is coloring with.</p>	<p>Use basic colors of food coloring and water or paint (red, blue, yellow) and mix colors to make new ones. Then make a picture with your water or regular paints! Try to make colors like purple, orange, and green!</p>
