Pre-Writing	<p>Letter search- Have your child search for the first letter of his name on household items (cereal box, toothpaste tube, clothing). Write the letter on a small piece of paper for your child to match, or find the lowercase form of the letter).</p>	<p>To prepare for this activity, use small paper (such as index cards or post its), and write one letter on each paper. Fill a cake pan or other shallow containers with salt, and have your child copy the letters by using his finger, in the salt.</p>	<p>Letter Hunt with Recycled Newspaper: Items needed a newspaper. You can give your child a newspaper and have them find letters in their name, numbers, and pictures that they have interest in.</p>	<p>Letter R. Dot the letter R for your child to trace. After practicing tracing have your child make the letter R. Discuss the sound of the letter R.</p>	<p>Write a letter or draw a picture. Mail it to a friend, or to your teacher. You will need paper, crayons, an envelope, and a stamp.</p>
Math	<p>Free, printable Treasure Chest (Pirate) Counting Mats</p> <p>https://funlearningforkids.com/pirate-treasure-addition-mats/</p> <p>Look for things around your house that you can use like coins, gems, or small toys.</p>	<p>Have your child count all of the windows and doors in your house. Talk about which is more, and how many more. Ask the shape of the doors and windows. Your child could practice drawing shapes.</p>	<p>Puzzles from Recyclables: Items needed any old cereal boxes, cracker boxes, any household item boxes you are no longer using. Take a picture of the box before you cut it into pieces. Have the child look at the picture while trying to put the box puzzle back together to make it look like it did when in one piece.</p>	<p>After completing your physical education activity, take the items out of the bin and count. After counting how many items are in each bin talk about which bin had the most items and which bin had the least items.</p>	<p>Use paper to cut out circles to use as pancakes. Write numbers on the pancakes. Use a spatula to flip the pancakes over. Can you identify the numbers on the pancakes. Science/ Social Studies	<p>As a family, make up a list of “treasures” that you could find in the outdoors. Divide your family into teams and go on a Treasure Hunt.</p>	<p>Talk about the season of Spring. Take a walk outside (use your newly created binoculars!), and ask your child to notice how the trees are changing, flowers that are growing, and the change in weather. Look for and listen to the birds.</p>	<p>Recycled Planters - Use any type of bottle, seeds or beans, and a string. Cut the water bottle in half, put string in the bottom near the top of the bottle where we drink out of and put dirt and seeds in the top piece with the string facing down. Fill the bottom part of the water bottle with water. Take the cap off the bottle and allow the string to come out the top of the bottle where we would drink so the string touches the water. Put the bottle in sunlight, and watch your seeds grow. Make sure to keep it watered so it continues to grow each day.</p> 	<p>Make a cardboard bird feeder. You will need cardboard, scissors, a small piece of wood, peanut butter and birdseed. Make a small hole in the cardboard on each side, add the string, place the wood through the cardboard for the bird to sit on, cover the cardboard in peanut butter, then cover the peanut butter in birdseed. Hang outside for the birds to come eat.</p>	<p>Use playdough to make your own pancakes. Physical Education	<p>Put a tennis ball (or another small ball) in the center of two players. Say a word. Keep saying one word at a time until you say TREASURE. When the players hear that word, they both try to grab the ball. The first player to get it wins the round. Keep going until every player sees that he/she will win some and lose some, but always keep trying.</p>	<p>Create an obstacle course for your child. Provide opportunities to crawl through, jump over, skip and hop. This could be inside or outside. Ask your child to help create the obstacle course with you.</p>	<p>Go on a nature walk and collect trash to help clean up the earth.
