

# COVID-19 PANDEMIC DISCLOSURE AND SCREENING TOOL



Parents play a crucial role in keeping everyone in the facility safe and reducing the risk of exposure. Prior to attending class, please check your child for the following:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Fever of 100 degrees or more</li><li>• <b>New</b> uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing</li><li>• Children with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough: a <b>change</b> in their baseline cough</li><li>• Lack of smell or taste</li><li>• Shortness of breath</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Sore throat</li><li>• Muscle aches</li><li>• Headache</li><li>• Congestion or runny nose</li><li>• Nausea/vomiting</li><li>• Extreme fatigue</li><li>• Frequent diarrhea</li><li>• Chills</li></ul>
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While we understand that many of these symptoms can also be related to non-COVID-19 related issues, we must proceed with an abundance of caution during this Pandemic.

## Please keep your child home if he or she:

- Has 2 or more symptoms from the above list.  
\* If exposure to COVID-19 has occurred, your child may remain in class as long as they do not have symptoms.

## Can return to class:

- If fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medication such as Acetaminophen (Tylenol) or Ibuprofen (Motrin).
- If symptoms are improving.
- If examined by a physician and medical documentation is provided (a Doctor's note) with return date.

*When in doubt, we recommend checking with your health care provider.*

## Positive COVID-19 Test

- If your child tests positive for COVID-19, they need to quarantine for at least 5 days. They may return to the center/classroom if they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication and if symptoms have improved. Upon return your child will need to mask from day 6 – 10 if age 2 or above.
- Please notify someone at your center/classroom or the nurse for your county if your child has a positive COVID-19 test.

## Mask Wearing in the Classroom

- Indoor masking for staff, children and visitors is required only when community levels are high.
- Masks are not worn during meal times, naps, or outdoor play.
- SUMMIT will encourage children to wear masks, when necessary, by using social stories, modeling and positive reinforcement, however, no child will be forced to wear a mask.
- A medical exemption note will be required for children that cannot wear a mask (during high community levels) due to medical conditions/disabilities.
