COVID-19 PANDEMIC DISCLOSURE AND SCREENING TOOL



Parents play a crucial role in keeping everyone in the facility safe and reducing the risk of exposure. Prior to attending class, please check your child for the following:

 Fever of 100 degrees or more New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing Children with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough: a change in their baseline cough 	 Sore throat Muscle aches Headache Congestion or runny nose Nausea/vomiting
 Lack of smell or taste Shortness of breath 	 Extreme fatigue Frequent diarrhea Chills

Covid-19 symptoms and positive COVID-19 Test

- While we understand that many of these symptoms can also be related to non-COVID-19 related issues, please keep your child home if your child is experiencing 2 or more symptoms.
- When your child is examined by a health professional, Physician, Physician's Assistant (PA), Nurse Practitioner (CRNP), please provide medical documentation (a written note) with a return date. When in doubt, we recommend checking with your health care provider.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19, please notify someone at your center/classroom or a SUMMIT nurse (contact information on the following page).
- If exposure to COVID-19 has occurred, your child may remain in class as long as they do not have symptoms.

Returning after having COVID-19 symptoms or a positive COVID-19 Test:

- If your child tests positive for COVID-19, they will be required to quarantine for **at least 5 days**. Upon return, in accordance with CDC guidelines, it is recommended that your child wear a mask from days 6 10 if age two or above.
- When your child returns, you must provide a written note from a health professional, which clears your child to return (with a return date) **or** indicates that your child has had a negative COVID-19 test result.
- A home test or any other negative test results that have not been reviewed by a health professional will not be acceptable for a child to return to the program.
- Without a return note from a health professional or a verified negative test, the child will be required to remain out of the classroom for 10 days.
- The child must be fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication, have improved symptoms, <u>and</u> a return note or a negative test from a health care professional.
