

# Bridge Replacement Project Continues on Route 522 in Spring Township

Motorists are advised that a bridge replacement project continues on Route 522 in Spring Township, Snyder County. Contractors began the removal and replacement of the existing bridge over an unnamed tributary to Beaver Creek. Motorists can expect lane shifts and slow-moving vehicles while traffic is being switched onto the temporary roadway. Motorists should be alert, slow down, and drive with caution while navigating the temporary roadway, which is expected to remain in place through December 2025.

Jay Fulkroad and Sons is the prime contractor for the \$2.67 million bridge replacement project. Work on the project includes construction of a temporary roadway, removal of the existing bridge and replacement with a box culvert. Additional work includes approach work, paving, line painting, guide rail, and removal of the temporary roadway. Work on this project is anticipated to be completed in the fall 2026.

### Reclamation Project Continues Next Week on Smalsh Barrick Road in Snyder County


Motorists are advised that lane restrictions continue next week on Smalsh Barrick Road (Route 1009) in Middlecreek and Jackson townships, Snyder County, for a reclamation and paving project. This project is scheduled to be completed by late July, weather permitting.

seven of the ten races getting into the books. Another disturbing trend in sports is how easy it is to bet on a game. All you need is a phone and credit card and you can place a bet on most anything. This is a far cry from what it was like thirty years ago when you called a bookie to make a bet for you... so I hear.

It's not just the final score with or without the spread, but prop bets are all the rage now. You can bet on Patrick Maholmes to throw for over 3.5 touchdowns in a game or under 1.5 TD's in the first half alone. You can wager on Saquon Barkley running for over 122.5 yards in a game or if he loses a fumble in the second half. I won't even get into the parlay facet.

Sports are becoming transactional because of the betting aspect. You no longer root for your team but the one you bet on.

Did you know that in baseball you can bet on whether the next pitch is going to be a ball or strike? This is what recently launched an FBI and MLB investigation into Cleveland Guardians pitcher Luis Ortiz.

Apparently there was an abnormal amount of money placed on two pitches Ortiz threw in different games. Wagers placed on those two pitches were they would be a ball and not a strike. Both pitches were not even close to strikes that Manny Sanguillen would not even have

We live in the computer age and it's way too easy to place a bet. It's also easy in the AI world for Major League baseball to monitor every pitch with various metrics. 



### Local Student Honored at Annual SkillsUSA Workforce Development Event

Career and technical students in Pennsylvania won one of the nation's highest awards at the 2025 SkillsUSA Championships, held in Atlanta, on June 25-26. More than 6,500 students competed at the national showcase of career and technical education. The SkillsUSA Championships is the largest skill competition in the world and covers 1.79 million square feet, equivalent to 31 football fields or 41 acres.

First place state winners were invited to the event to demonstrate their technical skills, workplace skills and personal skills in 114 hands-on competitions including robotics, automotive technology, drafting, criminal justice, aviation maintenance and public speaking. Industry leaders from 850 businesses, corporations, trade associations and unions planned and evaluated the contestants against their standards for entry-level workers. More than 1,200 industry judges and technical committee members partici-

pated this year.

A total of 1,250 gold, silver and bronze medals were presented to students on Friday night, June 27 at the SkillsU-SA Awards Session. Many winners also received industry prizes, tools of their trade or scholarships. The medalists also received a Skill Point Certificate representing workplace readiness in the student's occupational specialty. Students can add the certificate to an employment portfolio. As an indicator of proficiency, Skill Point Certificates were awarded to national contestants who medaled or who met a threshold contest score for their event.

The following students received a SkillsUSA Championships medal and Skill Point Certificate from your area:

Team I (consisting of Cordell Yoder, Dominic Scott Benjamin Rowan, Ezra Carr), from Sun Area Technical Institute (New Berlin), was awarded the High School Gold

medal in TeamWorks.

"More than 6,500 students from every state in the nation participated in the 2025 SkillsUSA Championships," said SkillsUSA Executive Director Chelle Travis. "This showcase of career and technical education demonstrates SkillsUSA at its finest. Our students, instructors and industry partners work together to ensure that every student excels. This program expands learning and career opportunities for our members. The SkillsUSA Championships event is held annually

for students in middle school, high school or college/postsecondary programs as part of the SkillsUSA National Leadership & Skills Conference. The national, nonprofit partnership of students, instructors and industry is a verified talent pipeline for America's skilled workforce that is working to help solve the skills gap.



In addition, he holds the single game punting average record 52.0 yards (1978). His career longest punt was 70 His post season awards included leading the MAC Con-

ference in punting three of his four years while at Juniata and was selected to the MAC Conference 1st Team in 1978. In 1978, he was named to the Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference Southern Region 1st team and 2nd team 1975. He was the recipient of an Outstanding citation award at the Juniata football awards convocation. The first time such an award was given.

Reed also held NCAA Division III national year-end rankings during his career at Juniata. Out of 240 football programs, he was ranked 8th nationally in 1975, ranked 7th nationally in 1977, and ranked 3rd nationally in 1978 His highest national ranking during any one single season occurred in mid-October 1978 when he ranked second. In May of 1978, he signed as a free agent punter with the Buffalo Bills

Reed a 1975 graduate of Selinsgrove was a standout three sport athlete and was inducted into Selinsgrove's Sports Hall of Fame in 2024. He received his Bachelor's degree in Accounting from Juniata College and a Master's degree in Healthcare Administration from the University of St. Francis.

#### Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed Activity in a 100 Year Floodplain **DATE: July 11, 2025**



To: All interested Agencies, Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that Snyder County under 24 CFR Part 58 has determined that the following proposed action under Community Development Block Grant fund, contract numbers C000089767, C000093529, and pending FFY 2025, is located in the 100-year floodplain, (Zone AE) of the Susquehanna River, Penns Creek, and Wesier Run and Snyder County will be identifying and evaluating practicable alternatives to locating the action within the floodplain and the potential impacts on the floodplain from the proposed action, as required by Executive Order 11988, as amended by Executive Order 13690, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 in Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Protection of Wetlands. The proposed project location is in Selinsgrove Borough, Snyder County. The extent of the FFRMS floodplain was determined using freeboard value approach. The designated proposed activities include a potential area of effect from the Isle of Que, in its entirety, and the area east of North High Street from West Spruce Street to Bridge Street, and east of Strawberry Alley, with portions of Market Street from the borough's southern boundary line to West Spruce Street, including a portion of Weiser Run west to David Street; as reflected in the best available data. The work will be phased but will likely include: paving restoration/ reconstruction, drainage, curbing, curb cuts, sidewalks, and flood mitigation techniques on Chestnut Street (Front Street to Second Street), Walnut Street, South Front Street, Bough Street and Third Street. Demolition of structures may or may not be included in the scope of work. Asbestos and lead abatement will be conducted by PA Standards; sites not currently identified. The project is approximately 300 acres and encompasses approximately 5 acres of floodplain. All areas of earth disturbance will be returned to their original condition; best management practices will be implemented during project activities, and native plant species will be planted or restored. There will be no change in the footprint as a result of the project, and it

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplain and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Commenters are encouraged to offer alternative sites outside of the floodplain alternative methods to serve the same project purpose, and methods to minimize and mitigate project impacts on the [floodplain/wetland]. 
